Nina Teicholz: Another one... I'm very happy that Zoe talked about the Tim Noakes trial, because this effort to really silence low-carb voices around the world, I mean professor Noakes is one and probably the most prominent, but there was also the case of Jennifer Elliott in Australia I think, who had her nutritionist license taken away from her for counseling low-carb even though she'd been working as a health practitioner for 25 years.

Gary Fettke, who is with us today in the audience, from Tasmania... He is an orthopedic surgeon. The orthopedic surgeons are the people who cut off the limbs of diabetics when they have to have their limbs amputated.

So he had many diabetic patients and he started to realize that if he counseled them to eat less sugar, maybe there would be fewer amputation, that he could help them. And his local nutritionists dietitians Association basically put a gag order on him and told him that he was not allowed to counsel people not to eat sugar, that he had...

I don't remember the exact words... He had "dangerously cured his patients of diabetes."
